Literacy:

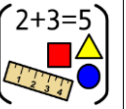
Autumn 1 - Letters from the Lighthouse
 We're writing a letter from the government to parents in London to persuade them to evacuate their children to the countryside to evade the Blitz. We will then be writing a diary entry, using hyperbole to embody a character. We will use relative clauses and parentheses.



Autumn 2 – Leon and the Place Between
 We will begin by writing a non-chronological report about WW2 to summarise what we have learned during Autumn 1. Next, we write a 'portal story'; our character will be transported to a magical place for an adventure. This is a chance to expand our vocabulary and create powerful descriptions.

Maths:

In Autumn Term, we ensure our children's Mathematical foundations are really solid. We begin by exploring place value of numbers up to 10,000,000 and their relationships to each other. We then work hard to master written methods of calculation for all four operations of maths. In the second half term, we will spend a lot of time using fractions; adding, subtracting, multiplying and dividing with them, as well as converting between fractions and decimals and finding fractions of amounts. We will be fractions experts in no time!



Science:

Autumn 1
 Violet Base will explore the cardiovascular system. We will learn about the heart and its functions, with the chance to dissect a real heart! We will also learn about the components of blood, and explore how to keep our hearts healthy through diet and exercise. A really fun, hands on topic.



Autumn 2
 Next we will learn about evolution and inheritance, learning the process of fossilisation and using fossils to learn about living things from millions of years ago. We will also research the many different ways that animals and plants have adapted to suit the environment in which they live.

Humanities:

History - World War II
 In this fantastic topic, we will consider the events leading up to the outbreak of war, the impact it had on different groups of people from all around the world, and the legacy it leaves behind, including the lessons to be learned by us in modern day Britain.



Geography – Coasts
 As a country surrounded by coastline, it seems apt that we spend time learning how landscape has been formed over millions of years by the sea. We will study various features of coastlines including rock formations, and learn how these have been impacted by environmental and human factors over time. We will also consider how we can help protect our coastlines for future generations.

PSHE:

Our first focus is on human rights; we will learn about migration (including the experience of refugees) and the potential causes and consequences of homelessness before delving into the UN Convention on the Rights of the Child. This is an important exercise in empathy, plus a chance to engage with very pertinent current events. As we will learn, rights also come with responsibilities, and our children will consider their responsibilities to themselves, others and the world.



PE:

We are very excited to have the Jason Robinson Foundation working with us again this year; they will be with us until Christmas helping us to play tag rugby. We will be honing essential footwork techniques, helping us to improve our agility and coordination. Additionally, the children will learn the basics of sending and receiving, crucial skills for various sports. These activities not only enhance physical abilities but also encourage teamwork and communication among peers.



Religious Education:

This term, we will be exploring rites of passage and questioning why they can be so formative in people's lives, particularly in their religions. Children will learn how Jewish people celebrate growing up with Bar Mitzvah ceremonies and the significance of Amrit for Sikhs and confirmation for Christians.

Alongside this, we will be considering the responsibilities we must all take on as we grow up.



Computing:

Children will continue to build on the coding skills they have learnt in Year 5. By gradually creating longer and more complex algorithms, we will begin to see how computer games are developed and the pain-staking work that goes into such a process. Alongside this, we will continue to develop the children's awareness of internet safety, teaching them how to navigate the web, including social media, in a way that keeps them safe and happy.

Art:

To coincide with our WW2 topic, we explore the work of two contrasting artists: LS Lowry and Charles Alston. We will emulate elements of both of their art by creating a WW2 propaganda poster which will require us to develop our use of perspective, cross-hatching and lettering to create an impactful large scale drawing. We are also very lucky to be visiting Leeds Art Gallery this term through our IntoUniversity focus week; we look forward to being culture vultures!
